## A Message from the Carntval Chairwoman

I cannot believe it was forty years ago that I was first the Carnival Chair. I was in my early 20s and was the first female to take on the role. I remember nearly half the first meeting was spent deliberating over how to refer to me (to be honest, I can't remember what we decided!) I really feel that I learnt from the best; Mrs. Betty Heaman was the Carnival Secretary, her husband Bill, and Brian Doidge were tar barrel and torch experts, Mrs. Pam Balsdon, Mrs. Pat Bottoms, Mrs Judith James, and Mr. Dennis Bater were all enthusiastic serving members at that time (to name but a few!) The meetings were often long with zealous conversation - nothing has changed there! In those days we held all our meetings in Dennis and Lesley's fish and chip shop café.

Sometimes people are worried about the future of our Carnival, but I often take five minutes to look around the committee, and to be honest although the faces are different, we still have amazing, passionate people of all ages, wanting to do their best for the Carnival. The energy of the whole committee is truly wonderful. Our Carnival should be safe well into the future. That said, we are always in need of more help at our fundraising events and especially on Carnival day. Sadly, earlier this year we lost two Carnival stalwarts. Dale's father, Brian Chasty passed away in the spring. He absolutely loved the Carnival and was so happy when his son, Dale, became involved with the making of the tar barrels.

We also lost one of the longest running Carnival tableaux creators, my mum, Mrs. Shirley Dilling. She was the granddaughter of Mrs Lily Pillivant. Lily was part of the very first committee (if they officially had them back then) who created the Hatherleigh and Meeth Hospital Association Carnival in 1903. I'm sure she would be impressed at the massive spectacle that is now known as Hatherleigh Carnival. She would also be very proud that so many of her children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, and great, great grandchildren have continued in her footsteps, both on the committee and taking part every year with our family's crepe paper float and as walking guys - Carnival is in our blood! Because of this, we as a family have decided to give a cup in mum's memory entitled 'Most Creative Use of Crepe Paper'

You will probably notice that following our opinion poll, we have reintroduced judging for the children's afternoon procession. Importantly though, there still remains a class (class 1) for those who just want to join in the fun, but do not wish to be judged.

Important! Please do remember that fireworks should NEVER be thrown near people, especially children. If you are entering a Carnival float, please do check our Carnival rules as these are carefully written to help keep everyone safe. Thank you. Please try to give generously to any of our street collectors. Silver coins would be amazing, if possible, please! Remember – Cash is King! But if you don't carry cash, please look out for our new QR codes and our Sum Up machines. Every pound helps!

Finally, on behalf of the Carnival Committee I want to thank you all for your generosity, time, and support, not only on Carnival day itself but throughout the whole year.

As the granddaughter of Mrs Lily Pillivant, one of the founder members of the Carnival, Shirley Dilling was a lifelong carnival stalwart. Since the 1960's Shirley, along with her family have created at least one float every vear. She was infamous for her intricate crepe paper pictures and had a real love for bringing little animals almost to life, not to mention the hundreds and thousands of crepe paper flowers she must have made! Shirley was very proud of the Beatrix Potter float she made over 25 years ago. The family treasure the Mrs Tiggy- Winkle and Peter Rabbit pictures that are still going



strong. Another of her favourites was 'Olly' the owl, and she often spoke of the numerous flags she papered all around their 1992 Olympic float. Very sadly, Shirley passed away in January this year, and she will be missed by so many. In her memory the 'Dilling, Wonnacott, Squire, Bater, King and Lumby' families felt it would be a fitting tribute to Shirley's passion and have donated a cup which will be awarded for the "Most Creative Use of Crepe Paper".

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

As we are sure you are aware, this year's Carnival takes place on Friday 10th and Saturday 11th November. We are writing to you to make you aware of where and when the parking restrictions and road closures will apply.

The following streets/roads will be closed at the times listed below:




Hatherleigh Carnival 10th/11th November - Road Closures/diversions

Please note that any vehicle parked in contravention of the parking restrictions may be liable to be issued a Fixed Penalty Notice served by the Traffic Enforcement Officers.

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- \* In the interest of safety it is the responsibility of the float operators to ensure trailers entering the carnival are in a condition of roadworthiness.
- \* Any local entry displaying a sponsorship sign will be disqualified, forfeiting their grant and the right to be judged. Entrants may display "loaned" by signs for the following items only: tractors, trailers, generators and lighting.
- \* All entries/persons <u>MUST</u> comply with Road Traffic Regulations.
- \* <u>A SAFETY CHAIN</u> must be fitted from towing vehicle to trailer. If one is not fitted the entry will be disqualified from the carnival.
- \* It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that they are in the correct class and to ensure they can get around the carnival route.
- \* Insurance details form to be displayed on the towing vehicle.
- \* IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY YOU MUST NOT JUMP ON AND OFF YOUR TABLEAUX WHILST IT IS MOVING OR DURING THE PROCESSION, UNLESS THERE IS AN EMERGENCY. STRICTLY NO ROCKING OF FLOATS!
- \* STRICTLY NO ALCOHOL to be consumed on any tableaux.
- \* **NOTHING** may be thrown, sprayed or allowed to escape from any tableaux.
- \* ALL TABLEAUX MUST CARRY A FIRE EXTINGUISHER.
- \* In the interest of safety, some form of restraint or handhold <u>MUST</u> be fitted to floats for the use of participants. A rope should be provided around the trailer when a strap or handhold is not practical.
- \* The entrant to nominate one person walking beside the tableaux to wear a marshal's bib.
- The judge's decision is FINAL.

PLEASE NOTE THAT ON THE NIGHT ITSELF A CARNIVAL OFFICIAL <u>WILL</u> BE CHECKING ALL OF THE ABOVE.

ALL TABLEAUX ARE TO ASSEMBLE IN THE MARKET QUARTER BY 5.45PM FOR JUDGING AT 6PM PROMPT. CLASSES 1 and 2 MAY ENTER VIA HOLE COURT BY PRIOR ARRANGEMENT.

ALL TABLEAUX ARE TO BE REGISTERED IN THE MARKET OFFICE BY 6.00PM. (Please collect your marshal's bib) If there is an unforeseen problem (such as a flat tractor tyre) then it should be reported to the market office by 6.00pm.

Exceptions do not include the lights, music not working or the weather.

#### STRICTLY NO FIREWORKS OR BANGERS

ANY TABLEAUX NOT IN THE MARKET QUARTER AND REGISTERED BY 6.00PM WILL NOT BE JUDGED BUT MAY STILL TAKE PART IN THE PROCESSION.

- \* All tableaux to arrive at Market Quarter via A386 bypass by 5.45pm for judging at 6.00pm prompt. Classes 1 and 2 may enter via Hole Court by prior arrangement.
- \* Tableaux arriving after 6.00pm will **NOT** be judged but may still take part in the Procession.
- If raining when all tableaux leave the Market Quarter, children from tableaux may (if they wish) walk up through Market Street to the top of Town, while the Tableaux travel around to line up for the Procession.
- \* The Band Leaders to make the decision of the Mass Bands taking place. A representative of the bands to inform the Committee at Market Office by 7.00pm.
- \* The Committee reserve the right to change any of the above as unforeseen circumstances dictate.
