
A Message Iran aur arnival Presidents





Behind the Stenes

Hatherleigh carnival is well known for its famous tar barrels and torchlight procession. Every year a dedicated group of people of all ages come together to build the torches, the frame and of course the tar barrels themselves.

But why do we do this? According to research, the tar barrels date back as far as the 1800s and originated with The Gun Powder Plot. Some say it's a pagan inspired ritual connected to the Samhain festiva whereby the barrels are pulled through the streets to ward off any evil spirits for the coming year. It was in the early 1900s that the Church and townspeople decided to create a celebration for all



ages, incorporating the traditional past with a parade and in doing so, they wanted to raise money for the Royal Devon and Exeter hospital. Don't forget, there was no N.H.S. back then! And so, in 1903 the very first Hatherleigh Carnival was held! Tradition also states that every year there are at least 52 torches made, representing each week of the year. Also, the

frame is to be made from at least 12 torches (one for each month of the year) There are also two individual crosses created that are paraded at the front of the procession.

The first Tar Barrel Run is at 5.00 a.m. on carnival morning. The second Tar Barel Run is after the main procession has finished and the streets are clear and deemed safe. This can be at any time from around 9.00 p.m. to 9.45 p.m.

Hatherleigh carnival is very popular for many reasons and one of the biggest reasons is the fact that some carnival families and friends still create floats using a very traditional style – crepe paper! The use of crepe paper started in the late 19th century. Many carnivals across the world still use crepe paper in a variety of ways to decorate both large and small trailers, creating amazing images of stunning beauty and creativity.



Here in Hatherleigh, we are very fortunate to have people willing to donate many hours of their time to cut and stick hundreds of rolls of crepe paper and turn it into the fantastic floats that lead our carnival each year!

Crepe paper is very versatile and will nearly cover anything. The transformation can be very exciting and unbelievable sometimes! You may start with a plain wooden construction or a brown paper bag with a rough sketch, but after sticking thousands



of strips of crepe paper, placed carefully to overlap, the finished object is totally transformed into a colourful crepe paper creation!





New for 2025

This year we are honoured to have two new trophies donated in memory of two special ladies.



Jean Newcombe was a big part of the Carnival - from creating family floats, serving as president and selling badges! She

was on the committee for many years. Although she's no longer with us, her love for the carnival remains in our memories. Her cup is the Carnival Queen/King Perpetual Cup





As a family we wanted to donate a cup in memory of our mum Olive Reynolds. Mum loved carnival and was involved in one way or another for the large majority of her life. When mum moved to Hatherleigh, all the way from Iddesleigh, in her 20's, which would have been in the 1940's, she lodged with Annie Short, in the house next to the church vestry (Gym). Annie was involved in carnival and mum helped her make paper flowers for their float. Having four children, mum always dressed us all up for the afternoon processions, joining with other families and walking with us all the way from Claremont to Sportsfield.

Also in the 1960's and 70's our parents produced floats with the methodist chapel - the most memorable one for them was the pilgrim fathers when they made the mayflower ship on a trailer. They built many floats with the Balsdon family, all our costumes were made from crepe paper, sewn on hand sewing machines. In the late 1970's and 80's she joined up with the Baters (Dennis & Les), Reynolds (Bill & Marg) and Squires families

producing the memorable Willow Pattern and a Peep into Toyland. She was an avid supporter of the carnival, and was on the committee, where she was treasurer, we were never sure how she managed all this because she would often serve behind the counter in the chip shop on carnival night, when she had finished her treasurers role in the market. Then in 2003 she was asked to be president, she never was one to be the centre of attention, much preferred to be working away in the background, but she was thrilled, and honoured, to be asked and loved her day. We felt she would also be honoured to have a cup presented in her memory. Her cup is the **Olive Reynolds Memorial Cup** and will be awarded for the Walking Guys.

This year, Ros Charlton Chard will be celebrating 25 years of representing Hatherleigh as our official town crier. The carnival committee would like to take this opportunity to express a massive thank you to Ros for everything she has done for our carnival and for the town.

We are so looking forward to the now annual Town Crying competition held just after 11.00 a.m. on carnival morning.

For those of you who don't know very much about town crying, Ros has kindly written down some of the background to this quite ancient of traditions.

Town Crying by Ros

A cry always starts with three 'oyez' and finishes with 'God save the King'. Each crier must use between 100 – 125 words.

Each competitor is judged on the loudness and sustained volume, the diction inflection and the clarity. The dress is judged separately, and great care is taken to keep to the correct period chosen.



The noble art of town crying goes back to Greek and Roman times. Sometimes they were referred to as Heralds. As town crying evolved, each town had a town crier who held a very important position because most people could not read or write this was the only way townsfolk would find out what was happening around them (obviously there was no television or radio!) Town criers also had the authority to expel any troublemakers from the town. They also went around at night to check all



the fires were either put out or had a metal cover over them. This was known as 'coure fai' as in old Norman French. (Don't forget – all buildings were made of wood at that time!)

As town crying further evolved the crier was placed before the fire brigade and the police and they got the name of 'Peelers'.

Today, Town Criers take part in many processions, festivals, make announcements for birthdays, weddings and funerals. In fact, everything as long as it's not political, racist or rude. Town crying was the first profession to have men and women treated as equals.


With South Street still closed we have had to change the route for this years' Tar Barrel runs and Carnival Procession.




As has been the case in previous years, cones will be placed around the town to keep the carnival route clear (see map).

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- * In the interest of safety it is the responsibility of the float operators to ensure trailers and any vehicle entering the carnival are in a condition of roadworthiness.
- * All vehicles must also be road legal
- * Any local entry displaying a sponsorship sign will be disqualified, forfeiting their grant and the right to be judged. Entrants may display "loaned" by signs for the following items only: tractors, trailers, generators and lighting.
- * All entries/persons MUST comply with Road Traffic Regulations.
- * <u>A SAFETY CHAIN</u> must be fitted from towing vehicle to trailer. If one is not fitted the entry will be disqualified from the carnival.
- * It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that they are in the correct class and to ensure they can get around the carnival route.
- * Insurance details form & a signed copy of the rules and regulations to be displayed on the towing vehicle.
- * IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY YOU MUST NOT JUMP ON AND OFF YOUR TABLEAUX WHILST IT IS MOVING OR DURING THE PROCESSION, UNLESS THERE IS AN EMERGENCY. STRICTLY NO ROCKING OF FLOATS!
- * STRICTLY NO ALCOHOL to be consumed on any tableaux.
- * **NOTHING** may be thrown, sprayed or allowed to escape from any tableaux.
- * ALL TABLEAUX MUST CARRY A FIRE EXTINGUISHER.
- * In the interest of safety, some form of restraint or handhold <u>MUST</u> be fitted to floats for the use of participants. A rope should be provided around the trailer when a strap or handhold is not practical.
- * The entrant to nominate one person walking beside the tableaux to wear a marshal's bib and carry a collection bucket. Please return to OLD schools after the procession.
- The judge's decision is FINAL.

PLEASE NOTE THAT ON THE NIGHT ITSELF A CARNIVAL OFFICIAL <u>WILL</u> BE CHECKING <u>ALL</u> OF THE ABOVE.

ALL TABLEAUX ARE TO ASSEMBLE IN THE MARKET QUARTER BY **5.45PM** FOR JUDGING AT 6PM PROMPT. CLASSES 1 and 2 MAY ENTER VIA HOLE COURT BY PRIOR ARRANGEMENT.

ALL TABLEAUX ARE TO BE REGISTERED IN THE MARKET OFFICE BY **5.45PM.** (Please collect your marshal's bib) If there is an unforeseen problem (such as a flat tractor tyre) then it should be reported to the market office by 5.45pm.

Exceptions do not include the lights, music not working or the weather.

STRICTLY NO FIREWORKS OR BANGERS

ANY TABLEAUX NOT IN THE MARKET QUARTER AND REGISTERED BY 5.45PM WILL NOT BE JUDGED BUT MAY STILL TAKE PART IN THE PROCESSION.


